GROOMING SEMINAR

We had our Beginning Show Grooming seminar on January 28th at the C&E Dog Training Center in St. Louis Park. Leading us in our quest to better groom our Schnauzers was Mary Paisley of ToMar Kennels in Lacrosse, WI.

Whether new to or experienced at grooming the Standard Schnauzer, this seminar had something for everyone. Mary started the morning off with the importance of knowing your breed, the examina-



tion of our dogs from all sides, looking at both front and rear angulations. This was followed by those wonderful eyebrows and grooming the head; working around the tail; making the pelvis look broader/narrower; and how to shave the rear to look larger or smaller. She moved on to the reasons for stripping the necks tight; how to build up the thighs to even out the legs; and the need for balance (front



and rear) and how to achieve it. The second half of the session focused on scissoring and finishing techniques. Illusion can play a big role in how a dog looks in the ring, and with the right scissoring, this can be effectively achieved. This makes it important to spend time getting to know your dog's structure, and identify those spots that need work or enhancement.

Some Good Tips

Do you want to improve the condition of your dog's coat? Try using a boar bristle brush on it every day. And that sharp new stripping knife – try rubbing it in a can or jar of sand to dull the blade and you are less likely to cut something (like your hand?). If your Schnauzer has brittle furnishings, try rubbing some Kolestral (available at Sally's and



other stores) in their legs every day to condition them. It will attract dirt, so be sure to wash their legs out at the end of the week and start the process again. And when you use mousse on their legs—don't skimp! Be sure to use the extra hold—it works the best.

Many thanks to Sunny Lambert for taking on the task of organizing this very successful day, and to Mary for putting on such an informative seminar. I hope that it is something that we can repeat in the future. Happy grooming!

HSSC MEETING MINUTES

January 14, 2007

The new officers were announced and all were present:

President: John Limpert

Vice-President: Kristin Hauser

Old Business:

- The minutes were read, with no objections or additions heard they were approved as read.
- The first topic of business was the events already appearing on the 2007 club calendar. The first item is the Helping Paws Run & Romp on April 28, 2007. Greg Dineen updated the group regarding the role we play by assisting wherever needed, including handing out t-shirts.
- The second event mentioned was our Regional Specialty at Lake Elmo on August 25th. Discussion on this subject was tabled until later in the meeting.
- George Huddle spoke briefly on the HSSC Club Dog Walk to be held on either the last weekend in October or the first weekend in November.
- The final event mentioned was the annual meeting, held the first weekend in January to coincide with the Land O Lakes Dog Show in St. Paul.

New Business:

Scheduling of Meetings

The first topic of new business was the scheduling of meetings and the suggestion that we should attempt to schedule them to coincide with dog show events. The present 2007 calendar of shows was reviewed and meetings were planned for the following dates:

- 1. March 3, since there is a local rally/agility trial that weekend.
- 2. June 9/10 at the time of the Waconia/Lake Minnetonka show.
- 3. An August meeting to be scheduled in association with our specialty and dinner. It was suggested that perhaps we may wish to consider returning to the idea of having a potluck.
- 4. October/November meeting to coincide with our annual club walk around Lake Harriet.

Insurance

The next item was a discussion of the insurance costs, our present policy with the AKC, and possible options to reduce the amount of the premium. John reported on companies he was able to research on the web, with favorable results indicating products available at a lower cost. Following input from the Board, he agreed to continue researching options available to us, and will report at the March 3 meeting.

Specialty August 25

After a brief discussion of the merits and issues of a Friday Specialty, a motion was made, seconded, and passed unanimously to continue a dependent status for the 2007 Specialty held in conjunction with the St. Croix Kennel Club Show.

Communication

- Heartbeat Newsletter: The Board is making an energized attempt to upgrade communications. Discussion centered on ideas for items to include in the newsletter that would be of interest to the club members. Sunny Lambert, the outgoing editor, has agreed to send the recent club information to Pepper & Salt editors in time to meet the January 15th deadline. Kristin Hauser agreed to serve as editor for 2007.
- <u>Electronic Communication:</u> The discussion continued with the topic of expanded electronic communication, updates to the website, and greater circulation of the Newsletter. A possible chat-room scenario was discussed and John Limpert will be following up on the possibility of a Yahoo website.
- Outreach: The first step will be to update the membership list and George Huddle will prepare an updated mailing list by April 1. In addition we need to reach out to other Standard Schnauzer owners in our area. Suggestions included developing a resource center on our website; posting more fliers announcing our events; sending the newslet-

ter out to breeders; breeders presenting a one year membership to each new owner of one of their puppies; and aligning our club with other organizations in the area. It was suggested that we contact the Northstar Working Group Association, obtain more information and ideas on how they function, and determine if there is a way for us to participate in some of their activities. Kristin Hauser has contacted the club and will be attending their next meeting.

 It was suggested that we might want to consider fund-raising ideas, including the sale of T-shirts and sweatshirts with the club logo, which we will continue to discuss at our next meeting.

General Discussion

Several ideas have been suggested which could not occur without amending our Bylaws. Judi Hornbacher will create a new soft copy of the present Constitution and Bylaws and circulate copies to the Board for their review. Suggestions for amendments will be discussed during the March 3, 2007 meeting and any proposed changes or additions will be presented to the membership for a vote during the August 25th meeting.
