The American Kennel Club® (AKC®) expanded its litter of registered breeds on June 1 to welcome the American English Coonhound to the Hound group, Finnish Lapphund to the Herding group, and Cesky Terrier to the Terrier group – growing AKC's family to 173 breeds.

"The AKC is excited to add these wonderful breeds to our registry and give families even more dogs to choose from," said AKC Spokesperson Lisa Peterson. "From hunters to herders, each breed has a unique history, and makes loving, devoted family pets."



Comparable to a well-conditioned athlete, the <u>American English Coonhound</u> is an avid hunter known for its tremendous speed and loud voice. Originally these hounds were used to hunt fox by day and raccoon by night in the American colonies. Today, they still need regular daily exercise to stay in shape. They are affectionate dogs that appear alert and confident and make great companions for active owners. American English Coonhounds are sociable animals that get along well with people and other dogs. They are very

trainable and eager to please.



The <u>Finnish Lapphund</u> is an alert and agile dog. The first Finnish Lapphunds were the helper dogs of the Sami – a tribe of semi-nomadic people in the northern region of Finland, Sweden, and part of Russia called Lapland. Because they were originally bred to live and work outside north of the Arctic Circle herding reindeer, Finnish Lapphunds have a thick double coat. They are intelligent, eager to learn, and are calm and friendly with people. They make loving and devoted family pets that do well with children and other dogs.



Intelligent and full of energy, the <u>Cesky Terrier</u> was bred to hunt vermin, fox, and badger, among others. They are active dogs that love to play, and require daily exercise. Cesky Terriers are loyal to their families, patient, gentle, and get along well with people of all ages, making them a wonderful family pet. They are anxious to please and easy to train. Their coat requires daily grooming as puppies and brushing twice a week as adults.

HSSC History – Part I

Our thanks to Carol Smith for this wonderful article! Carol was kind enough to prepare the information in response to an earlier Board's request to put together a brief history of the organization. She has promised to find time in her busy schedule to prepare an installment of the next five years for an upcoming edition of the Newsletter.

THE FIRST FIVE YEARS - A Look Back Heartland Standard Schnauzer Club...1994-1999

Small groups of Standard Schnauzer friends had been getting together informally for a number of years. Then in the fall of 1994 Bill and Sherry Berkowitz called a group of standard owners/breeders together to determine interest in forming a "formal" Standard Schnauzer club. An introductory letter and survey of interest was completed with great support indicated for such a club.

On October 5, 1994 the initial organization meeting was held and temporary officers elected with Bill Berkowitz as President. We had 16 original members and a handful continue today. Bill wrote, in the first President's Letter, "The objective is to have a Club for all Standard Schnauzer owners/fanciers ...to emphasize practical projects which will benefit everyone". In November of 1994 the name of the Club "**Heartland Standard Schnauzer Club**" was selected from members' suggestions. Monthly membership meetings continued on the 1st Wednesday and a Club membership campaign with "An Open Letter to All Schnauzer Lovers" and Membership Application were done. Members developed committees, planned for a newsletter, set dues at \$15.00, opened a bank account, wrote a Constitution adopted from the American Kennel Club model and held the first Holiday party to celebrate, this celebration has continued.

The year 1995 had a lot of FIRST'S. Membership grew to 50 and 5 juniors – 13 members being from outstate Minnesota, Iowa and Wisconsin. In March Volume I Number 1 of the **HEARTBEAT** was published on gold paper, Ross Long was the Editor. It had the President's Message, an article written by a local veterinarian, The Scoop (from the backyard) about people and dogs, Secretary's Meeting Minutes, Editorial and a Calendar of Events all on four pages. Also in March the first education program was held on "Dog Dental Hygiene" followed in April with a "Grooming Clinic". We assisted with the rescue of a Giant Schnauzer. A contest for the Club logo was held with 5 entries submitted and in May members selected the logo we are using today. During October we held a Standard Schnauzer Fun Match and Doggy Dress-Up Parade, Katie Heetland, a junior owner quoted on the Schnauzer Biography for her Standard Schnauzer "I think inside Joe's heart there's a person". The first Annual Meeting and Elections for Heartland Standard Schnauzer Club were held in November.

As we moved into 1996: membership was strong at 44 and 4 juniors. Programs on semimonthly basis continued with varied topics as the "Standard Schnauzer Line Breeding History" and "Lost Dog Clinic and Poster". The Club moved membership meetings between member's homes and St Paul Dog Training Club. Shirts with the Club logo were ordered by members. A Fun Match Committee was formed and the Club's second Standard Schnauzer Fun Match was a success. Application was made to Standard Schnauzer Club of America for Local Specialty Club status which was granted in March of 1997. The second Annual Meeting was held and library material purchase of the SSCA GROOMING VIDEO approved.

The Club in 1997: strengthened with Committees developing and working. Membership leveled off at 35 voting and 5 juniors. The first auction in conjunction with a dinner or picnic happened which helped support the Club Treasury with excellent returns from items sold. A very successful All Breed Fun Match, our first, was held in March and the Standard Schnauzer Fun Match in November. Again, firsts occurred with the Club providing Standard Schnauzer placement prizes at the Lake Minnetonka and Rochester Kennel Club Shows. This practice continues today with the Club supporting entries at various shows. Heartland Standard Schnauzer Club has a web site; we were part of the first wave of SSCA clubs to do so. The first sites were very basic in comparison to the ones great ones everyone has today.

The Club in 1998: continued to work on Fun Matches and refinement of the Mission Statement. HSSC investigated hosting a National Specialty, but in February members voted not to proceed with the bid. As a member of the Minnesota Purebred Dog Breeders Association, the club exhibited Standard Schnauzers at the Minnesota State Fair, which we continued to do for a number of years.

In 1999: Heartland Standard Schnauzer Club turned five years old and found the Club maintaining membership in the 40's. We continued with membership meetings, programs, picnic and dinner with fund raisers. In February we held our first Herding Event, a cold but great day with no chops ending up on someone's table although a couple of Schnauzers thought it a good idea. Following the second All Breed Fun Match the Club made application to AKC to proceed to AO/BO matches and the first steps toward licensure.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Equisure has sent 2011-2012 renewal of insurance policy. <u>Question</u>: How should we handle publishing of not-yet-approved meeting minutes? Will email minutes ASAP to Board to be put in newsletter and on website, and will email General Member Meeting minutes to all members.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> \$2,441.82 currently in checking account. Checks from new members not yet deposited.

Activities Committee Report: No dates available for massage workshop with Jacque until fall due to her schedule. Michelle Bame as an alternate? Other? Committee will make a decision, and invites input from members on preferences. Herding workshop will probably be scheduled for September. Kara will get firm date. Too late to plan a July picnic for 2011, plus we will have Friday lunch and Saturday potluck at August Specialty. We will have a dog park day instead—will resume spring picnic in 2012. George stated that Julie Fogarty will be hosting a picnic for people who attend Duluth show in July. Kara will email Julie to send a notice to Roger for newsletter. Roger attended St. Croix Valley Kennel

Club meeting where RDOD (Responsible Dog Ownership Day) was discussed. Much discussion about other dates, but they conflict with other local shows, plus AKC requires RDOD to be held in September. We will be participating again this year. SCVKC will host organizational meeting for 2012 RDOD sometime during the winter. Biggest issue: publicity. No budget for this. Group brainstormed about ways to publicize. SCVKC is looking for people and clubs willing to donate \$\$ to help with advertising for 2012 RDOD

August Specialty Committee: Ouestion: Does SCVKC handle all communications re: hospitality? Show Chair (Marjana) will email judges for information on specific of their travel, lodging, meals, etc. and will give her's and Kara's cell phone numbers to judges for emergencies. Advertising for show includes: 1) Newsletter will ask people to bring food for Friday lunch potluck at show site (possible pulled pork as main dish—club would pay for it; Roger will research prices); 2) Kara distributed flyers at Bloomington, IL show and we will do so at National Specialty, also. Judges will be invited to our Friday Potluck Lunch. Will also have annual Potluck Dinner on Saturday evening. Need to decide on location. Park? Restaurant? We still need a really big prize for the raffle. Also need raffle items—Roger will ask for items in newsletter. Turkey Jerky (Grain-free and Low-fat)

1 lb ground turkey1 Tb Extra Virgin Olive Oil1/4 tsp garlic powder

Preheat oven to 200 degrees. Combine all ingredients together in a food processor and puree the mixture. Line a jelly roll pan with aluminum foil (for easy cleanup) and pour the mixture into it. Spread evenly. Bake 2 hours with the oven door slightly ajar to allow the moisture to escape. Remove from oven and using a pizza cutter or knife, cut into small individual sized portions. Place pieces back in the oven, flipped over and bake an additional 1-2 hours or until the treats are dry and leathery. Store in an airtight container in the refrigerator.
