I have Returned!

Another Standard Schnauzer Health Survey Enrollment begins January 1, 2015.

Let's make our dogs proud - complete the survey!

Background: The survey of the health of our breed conducted in 2008 enrolled 1455 dogs. **Overall, the health of our breed was good.**

Going Forward: The 2015 Health Survey

To continue to have an accurate picture of the health status of our breed, as well as the common causes of death, we again need information on a large number of dogs; the goal for 2015 is to enroll AT LEAST 2,200 dogs who were alive at any point between January 1, 2008 and December 31, 2014. YES – WE NEED INFORMATION ON HEALTHY DOGS. We need data on dogs who are "pets" (are not they all), (especially) dogs who died during the last 7 years, dogs NOT in breeding programs, un-registered dogs and, <u>yes</u>, dogs who were enrolled in the 2008 survey (they are now 7 years older).

EVERY Standard Schnauzer enrolled provides valuable information!!

Approach: The approach and instrument are similar to those previously employed, short and user-friendly forms available in several formats with completed forms returned to a non-dog club member third party, who will remove names, return addresses, email addresses, etc that could potentially identify the owner or individual submitting the date. *This insures the confidentiality of all data submitted, a point that cannot be overemphasized.* We expect much of our dogs and in return, they should expect the same of us. The future of our breed is our collective responsibility. **We are our dog's champions!**

The survey form will be available from the SSCA website (<u>www.standardschnauzer.org</u>) beginning January 1, 2015.

AND discuss the importance of this survey with every Standard Schnauzer family. Encourage them to participate! We need your help.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

BOARD REPORTS:

• President:

- 1) There were a number of good comments about our August Specialty, prizes and the dinner.
- 2) There is another health survey coming in January from SSCA. Goal is to get information on 2200 dogs and will involve all dogs who are alive for 1 minute anytime during the past 7 years going back to 2007.
- 3) At the SSCA National Specialty's Annual Awards Banquet, the number of awards was: 233 agility, 106 preferred agility, 60 obedience, 61 rally, 18 herding, 42 Grand Champion.
- 4) SSCA is working on a History Task Force to possibly create a database for dogs and pedigrees.

• Secretary:

- 2) Received "closed out event" letter from AKC re: August 2014 specialty.
- <u>Treasurer</u>: \$9,532.36 currently in account plus \$400 income from the August Specialty, but there are a few expense reimbursement requests still outstanding.

With this specialty so close in date to our annual August St. Croix Valley specialty, we will

probably not hold the St. Croix Valley specialty. We will form a committee in 2015 for the 2016 specialty. We will need to plan prizes for this event.

Unfinished Business: None.

NEW BUSINESS:

Annual General Membership Meeting: Will be held January 3, 2015. This will be a potluck dinner and annual elections will be held. We still need a location for this event.

2015 Nominating Committee: Consists of a Board member and 2 at-large members. Kelli Mullett has volunteers to head the committee.

2015 HSSC Specialty: need to establish a committee.

MORE THAN 4,100 DOGS TO COMPETE FOR TOP HONORS AT 14th ANNUAL AKC/EUKANUBA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Dogs from All 50 States and Over a Dozen Countries Will Vie for Best in Show

NEW YORK, NY (November 19, 2014) – In a record entry, 4,177 dogs will compete for the title of National Champion at the 14th annual <u>AKC/Eukanuba National Championship</u> on December 13 and 14, 2014 in Orlando, Florida. The show is held in conjunction with the <u>AKC Agility Invitational</u> and the <u>AKC Obedience Classic</u> (entries of 598 and 202 respectively) making for a combined entry of nearly 5,000 dogs competing in the three events.

"The AKC/Eukanuba National Championship week is a one-of-a-kind experience for any dog lover," said Dennis B. Sprung, AKC President and Show Chairman. "With thousands of dogs competing, nearly 160 AKC Meet the Breeds® booths, seminars and Judges Institutes, and new events like our Veterans Competition and the NADD/AKC Diving Dog Championship, there is nothing that can compare to this complete canine extravaganza."

Other events in the one million square feet of canine-centric event space during the week of December 9-14, 2014 include the:

- AKC Junior Showmanship Finals
- AKC National Owner-Handled Series Finals
- AKC Junior Agility Competition
- AKC Juniors Obedience & Rally Classic
- Specialty Shows, Group Shows and the FSS Open Shows
- Orlando cluster, consisting of the Space Coast Kennel Club of Palm Bay, the Brevard Kennel Club, the Central Florida Kennel Club and Orlando Dog Training Club

2014 HIGHLIGHTS:

Judges: Judge **Mr. Ronald Menaker** of Jupiter, Florida will select the AKC/Eukanuba National Championship Best in Show (BIS) winner. The owner(s) of the BIS winner will receive more than \$50,000 while the breeder(s) of the Best in Show winner will be awarded \$15,000. **Ms. Patricia W. Laurans** of Newtown, Connecticut will select Best Bred-By Exhibitor in Show from among 1,031 dogs (25% of the total entry) entered in the Bred-by-Exhibitor (dogs being shown by their owner/breeder) competition. Over \$51,000 in prize money will be awarded to Bred-By Exhibitor owners.

Veterans Competition: The Veterans Class will be open to all dogs and bitches seven years of age and older and a Best of Breed Veteran will be selected in each breed or variety. Veteran group judging will coincide with the Bred-By Exhibitor group judging on Saturday and Sunday afternoon with the Best Veteran in Show selected on Sunday evening by **Mr. Roger Hartinger**. The Veterans entry totals 220 dogs.

AKC National Owner-Handled Series Finals: This year, the AKC NOHS Finals Best in Show competition moves to the main ring on Saturday evening, judged by **Mrs. Charlotte P. Patterson**. Breed and group judging takes place on Friday, December 12. This invitation-only competition is open to the top ten ranked dogs in the AKC National Owner-Handled Series in each breed/variety from the 2014 qualifying year and drew an entry of 608 dogs representing 171 breeds.

AKC Juniors Classic: Junior handlers will now have the opportunity to compete in AKC Rally[®] as part of the new AKC Juniors Classic, which offers multiple levels of both obedience and AKC Rally[®] competition for juniors.

Streaming video: For those who can't be in Orlando in person, extensive event coverage will once again be offered free of charge via streaming video at www.akc.org. The evening events in the arena will be streamed live beginning at 6:00 pm each night. The Bred-By Exhibitor groups, Veteran groups, agility and obedience will be taped and available on demand at www.akc.org and live.eukanuba.com.

got involved with both obedience and agility right away. I think Duffy might have been the first Standard that most local folks saw in agility trials. My second Standard is Finn (CH Jordan Charlemagne of Windtree CDX GN RAE2 AX MXJ) bred by Sunny Lambert.

He is now 8 years old and we are currently working towards his agility MACH and obedience Utility titles (see photo of Finn power weaving). The



newest addition to the Schnauzer family is 5-month-old Laser (Jordan Laser of Echo Lake) bred by Kris and Les Gagner (see photo with his toys).
