



Looks as though being pretty just wears Bria out. "We had a fun time in Eau Claire, Wi. **Bria** was BOS both days." – Julie Fogarty







It began as a promise made in 1999 when my 15 year old Miniature Schnauzer, Rommel crossed the bridge. We would have another dog, but not until we had the time to devote to a puppy. The idea of a dog made retirement from a career that I loved downright exciting though I must confess that my husband was less enthusiastic. I began searching for the perfect dog in 2012, looked again at a mini, and researched a couple of other breeds. Our move to Cambridge, a walking friendly community, added to my desire for an active companion. Fortunately, the local kennel club hosted a show in June, just 6 weeks after our move. I downloaded a judging program and circled the Standard Schnauzers as a must see. I remember the entrants, being warmly greeted by Kris and Julia and Matt, introduced to Sunny and Gable and JJ, and the rest was history... I met the K litter puppies and committed to a puppy within a few weeks.

There was a twist in the process when Arnie, aka Jordan Ely of Windtree, became available at age 5. We thought about the prospect (about 20 minutes) and decided that it was fate. A dog needed a home and we needed a dog.

I met Arnie and his girls at a roadside rest area and immediately fell in love with this handsome dog. He was very brave going off with me armed only with a bag of treats and a water dish. Bone Bonanzas

Ingredients:

1/2 lb. ground beef, uncooked1/4 cup chicken broth1/3 cup mashed black beans1/3 cup cottage cheese1 tsp. soy sauce

Combine ground meat and chicken broth in a bowl. Add the black beans and cottage cheese. Add soy sauce. Mix all of the ingredients together thoroughly. Mold the mixture into bone shapes and place on a cookie sheet. Bake for 45 minutes in a 375 degree oven. Let cool.
